PROVIDE SUPPORT

Appoint a Lead or Co-Leads

Assemble a Steering Team

Provide data for the team

Provide resources for the team

DESIGN PATHWAYS

Give students a clear roadmap to end goals

Simplify their choices

Help new students choose and enter the program

Monitor their progress, giving frequent feedback and support as needed

Make Pathway available for new students registering for Fall 2016

SCALE AND SUSTAIN

Ensure that your design is intended to impact a significant number of students

Plan to allocate resources to sustain the effort over a significant period of time

Commit to sharing student outcomes with MCSS and other cohort colleges

TIMELINE

January-April 2015: Map programs (broad strokes)

May-August 2015: Begin adding details, design intake and monitoring processes

September-December 2015: Continue adding details

January-April 2016: Finalize default pathways

May-August 2016: Register students

September 2016: Students start on pathways

- Complete the Guided Pathways Initial Planning Template and discuss on campus
- Begin mapping your programs
- Analyze your ability to implement for new students:
 - Beginning in Fall 2016

INTENT TO PARTICIPATE

Colleges planning to participate in Cohort I should submit a letter of intent from your president **by January 30, 2015.**

- Describe your level of readiness for this work
- Outline your plans to design and implement pathways by fall 2016
- Letters must be 5 pages or less, double-spaced.

CREATING COHORTS

In the event that more than 10 colleges declare an intent to participate in Cohort I, MCSS will consult with JFF, the TA Providers and the affected colleges to determine the makeup of the first cohort.

Colleges who do not participate in Cohort I should continue the foundational work you have identified, begin mapping programs and attend “open” MCSS activities throughout 2015.
